SCORING MATTERS #YesItDoes with SUE DRINKWATER



CONGRATULATIONS: To Karen Brown for being accredited as a Level 1 scorer. It's great to have another scorer officially accredited and on the official ladder before we transition to the new Scorers' Pathway later this year.

DLS: A reminder that DLS has not been updated since version 5 came out in November 2022. They looked at how the stats had changed from recent professional white ball matches across the world and the resultant changes to par/target scores were minimal, so a decision was made not to update in 2024. As such, continue to use v5 of DLS Professional.

PCS Pro: There have been several recent updates to PCS Pro, so make sure that you are fully up to date before the season starts. Although most of the changes are for the professional game and don't contain anything visible for scorers, we still need to do them and they are best done separately, so don't leave them all until the season starts and expect to do them all in one go!

Gloucestershire Scorers WhatsApp Group: All GACO scorer members were invited to join this at the end of March and we currently have 26 active scorers in the group. If you didn't reply to the invitation email but are an active GACO scorer member and want to join, then send an email to Sue Drinkwater to be added in before the 2025 season starts. Hopefully it will provide an easy way to ask scoring questions and share scoring experiences throughout the 2025 season. If it proves successful, we will open it up to non-GACO scorers in Gloucestershire too.

GACO Scorers Pre-Season Meeting: By the time you read this, we will have held the first GACO Scorers Pre-Season Meeting via Zoom on 16th April. This is a new initiative and may be followed by more scorer gatherings on Zoom (or even face to face at some point in the future) to discuss whatever is wanted in the Gloucestershire Scoring Community.

UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT



People who are seeking advancement for the 2026 season need to complete and return the ECB 'Promotion' form and take the MCC Laws exam. Please note that umpires who are successful in upping their grading are not guaranteed a place on a higher panel next summer – for example, if 12 people across Gloucestershire, Somerset & Wiltshire moved from M4 to M3 and there were only four places available on the P1 Panel....

WEPL Captains' marks will be embargoed until the end of the season. Should poor feedback be received following a game and it is perceived there may be an issue of some description, the umpire(s) in question will be notified. This does not apply to either B & D or GCL matches.

Eight potential new umpires attended the 'Are You Ready to Call Play?' practical days at Hatherley & Reddings CC and Chipping Sodbury CC on Sunday 20th & Sunday 27th April respectively.

HARDBALL CRICKET BAGS for BRISTOL YOUTH CRICKET LEAGUE

Jim Donaldson, Chair of the BYCL explains the progress of the Hardball Cricket Bag scheme and how it is benefitting youth cricket in Bristol.

In 2024, the DFCA/Omnitau Bristol Youth Cricket League (BYCL) received the very generous donation of £5000 from the Members of the former Bristol Association of Umpires and Scorers (BACUS). The BYCL set this sum aside, and have used it to support the 'Hardball Kit Bag Award' Scheme. This aims to support any Club in the area that is working positively to further develop their youth system with a junior team playing Hardball Cricket for the first time. While the super, well-used ECB initiatives of 'All Stars' and 'Dynamics', encourage Clubs to start their youth systems as a beginning for youngsters on their cricketing journey, the next step into Hardball Cricket is a far more significant and expensive step for both clubs and parents. Providing a 'Team Hardball Kit Bag' for use by all is a critically important part of this process. During each assessment, the BYCL checks the on-going development progress of any Club applying for an Award, with the relevant County Cricket Foundation.



In 2024, two Clubs, Pucklechurch and Bristol Pakistanis, were supported with Awards, and are continuing well into 2025. We are delighted that a further three clubs have been awarded Hardball Kit Bags this year. Photographed receiving their Awards from Damian Forder (DFCA Coaching) and Jim Donaldson (Chair of the BYCL), are Josh Wiltshire (wearing black) from Bitton and James Hall (wearing red) from St Mary Redcliffe. In addition, a new kit bag is also on its way to Bohemians in time for the season ahead. We feel that this is a very positive way to support local clubs in the on-going and challenging process of developing their respective youth systems. And it's thanks to the members of the former BACUS that we are able to offer this opportunity to local cricket clubs, and we hope that more will be encouraged to come forward in 2026.

Tuesday 4th March: Initial National Panel conversation with ECB's Richard Glynne-Jones via 'Microsoft Teams'.

Wednesday 5th March: Attend the Cheltenham Indoor League presentation at Cheltenham CC and present long service awards to umpires Jim Hyland & Andy Todd and scorers Sue Drinkwater, Mike Turner, Geoff Trett, Andrew Marson & Linda Collinson.

Thursday 6th March: Phone conversation with Harry Watts at GCF regarding County Cup and Trophy umpires. Sort dates so we hopefully don't get any clashes with other competitions and arrange Round One to take place before the league season starts.

Friday 7th March: DBS & GDPR discussions with John Peplow Gloucestershire County Safeguarding Officer to gain clarification on current DBS renewal issues.

Saturday 8th March: DBS & GDPR discussions with David Elworthy from ECB to gain clarification on current DBS renewal issues.
